Liturgy Tip

"The supplication Agnus Dei (Lamb of God), is, as a rule, sung by the choir or cantor with the congregation responding; or it is, at least, recited aloud". General Instruction of the Roman Missal No 83.

Explanation of the Tip: the Choir or Cantor sings alone "Jesus, Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world" and the congregation joins in singing the response "have mercy on us". This is repeated once; the third time the congregation's response changes to "grant us peace".

Saints of the Week

Monday, October 19th: Saint John de Brébeuf, Priest, (died 1649, age 56) was savagely mutilated and slain near Georgian Bay

Saint Isaac Jogues, Priest, (died 1649, age 39) was tomahawked to death by Iroquois near Albany.

Other martyrs were Antony Daniel, Gabriel Lalemant, Charles Garnier, Noel Chabanel, and oblates René Goupil and Jean de la Lande; secondary patrons of Canada.

Tuesday, October 20th: Saint Paul of the Cross, Priest, (died 1775, age 81); born in Liguria; renowned preacher and founder of the Passionists, today numbering about 2,160 members, who combine the apostolate of retreats and missions with penitential monasticism.

Thursday, October 22nd: Saint John Paul II, Pope (died 2005, age 84), Karol Józef Wotjyla was born in Wadowice, Poland. As archbishop of Krakow, he took part in the Second Vatican Council. On October 16, 1978, he was elected pope and took the name John Paul II. His exceptional apostolic zeal, particularly for families, young people, and the sick, led him to make numerous pastoral visits throughout the world. He left as a heritage to the Church a rich Magisterium and the promulgation of the Catechism of the Catholic Church the revised Code of Canon Law for the Latin Church and Eastern Churches, and the third typical edition of the Roman Missal. Pope Francis canonized him on April 27, 2014.

Friday, October 23rd: Saint John of Capistrano, Priest, (died 1456, age 70); reformer of the Franciscans and Poor Clares; preached devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus; animated resistance against the Turks at the battle of Belgrade; patron of military chaplains.

Saturday, October 24th: Saint Anthony Mary Claret, Bishop; (died 1870, age 62), from Catalonia; vigorous reforming bishop of Santiago, Cuba; founded the Missionary Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, today numbering about 3,000 members; fostered credit unions and the apostolate of the press.
